Bin and Gone?



When the new refuse collection arrangements were introduced, Hardwicke Road remained on a weekly

collection rota, with seagull-proof sacks rather than wheelie bins. However, the council continues to look at whether these arrangements are the best ones, and changes can be made if it suits local people.

Tania said:

“When refuse collection arrangements were decided for Hardwicke Road, wheelie bins weren’t used because people have nowhere to store them. However, most people leave their seagull-proof sack outside the front of their property anyway, so it might be better to give everyone wheelie bins, which they can leave out at the front. Normally, the council doesn’t use wheelie bins where they would have to be left on the pavement, but in Hardwicke Road the pavements are wide and they wouldn’t cause an obstruction, and would probably look tidier than the seagull proof sacks left outside. It would be more convenient for residents too.”

So should the seagull proof sacks be replaced with wheelie bins (but still with a weekly collection)? Let us know what you think.

Council Budget: More Cuts

Hastings Council’s draft budget for 2015/16 is now out to consultation, with the council making a decision on the final budget later in February. With big cuts in central government grants—

much bigger than for other East Sussex councils, and one of the biggest percentage cuts in England, cuts to services have to be considered.



Peter said:

“The money Hastings gets from the government has gone down by more than half over the last four

years. We’ve continued to make real savings through efficiencies, with more to come, by getting people to apply for services online rather than face-to-face.

But some services will have to be cut—for example, grants to the voluntary sector are being reduced, and the Old Town Museum is earmarked for closure. Around 20 jobs will be lost. There are some bright spots though: we’re raising money through the Arts Council and others for celebrations of the 950th anniversary of the Battle of Hastings, and our bid for a £500,000 Coastal Communities grant for seafront improvements was successful. In future, we will be focusing more effort on bidding for alternative funding, from the EU especially. It looks like a lot more of the money we spend will have to be raised in this way if we’re to continue the regeneration of our borough.”

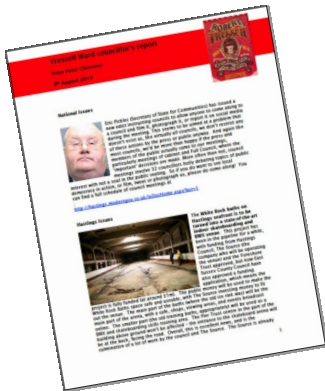
